


Figure 1 Research Conceptual Framework




Figure 2 Bing Xu's contemporary artwork *Book of Heaven*




Figure 3 Contemporary Artworks with Chinese Bagua Elements

Building on this foundation, artists should actively participate in cultural exchange activities and art exhibitions. Through showcasing artworks, hosting lectures, and workshops, they can share their artistic concepts and experiences with the public, fostering dialogue and interaction between traditional culture and contemporary art.

For cultural institutions, enriching cultural activities and program content is vital. They should organize more exhibitions, performances, lectures, and other events related to traditional culture and contemporary art. Establishing specialized cultural exchange platforms and artistic creation bases can provide artists with spaces and platforms to showcase their work and collaborate. Promoting interdisciplinary collaboration and exchange with other cultural institutions, artistic groups, and social organizations can further drive the exchange and innovation between traditional culture and contemporary art. Activities such as joint

exhibitions and collaborative projects can facilitate dialogue and interaction across different cultural domains.

For the public, enhancing cultural literacy and aesthetic education is key. By studying traditional cultural knowledge and participating in artistic activities, individuals can improve their understanding and appreciation of traditional culture and contemporary art. Visiting art exhibitions, attending performances, and reading relevant books can broaden perspectives and enrich aesthetic experiences. Moreover, the public can actively engage in cultural exchange activities, interacting with artists to understand their artistic concepts and cultural connotations. Participating in artist lectures, studio visits, and art workshops can deepen understanding of the artistic process and stories behind artworks, enhancing awareness and experience of traditional culture and contemporary art.

By implementing these practical recommendations, the exchange and innovation between traditional culture and contemporary art can be promoted, injecting new energy and vitality into the development and progress of the cultural field.

Through the exploration of traditional culture and contemporary art, a deeper understanding is gained of how traditional elements are creatively incorporated into artworks by artists. It is observed how this trend reflects the evolution of aesthetic trends and cultural identity. The reinterpretation of tradition not only enriches the form and content of artistic creation but also enhances the audience's awareness and understanding of traditional culture. However, it must also be acknowledged that controversies and challenges may arise in this process, such as concerns about balancing traditional and contemporary aesthetics and potential cultural distortions. Therefore, the discussion of traditional cultural elements in contemporary art is not only a reflection on the aesthetic value of art itself but also a profound reflection on cultural identity and societal change (Huang & Li, 2023: 177).

Suggestion

1. Interdisciplinary research: Incorporating interdisciplinary methods into the proposed research scope, including aesthetics, cultural research, sociology, and psychology, can lead to a more comprehensive understanding of traditional cultural elements in contemporary art. By utilizing interdisciplinary research methods, one can explore the evolution of aesthetic trends and the influence of these elements on cultural identity. For example, one could investigate how artists reinterpret traditional culture and analyze the impact of this reinterpretation on contemporary social values and cultural identity.

2. Art practice and theory: It is suggested to integrate theoretical research with art practice, thereby enriching the research content through insights gained from artists and their creative processes. This approach aids in understanding how artists incorporate traditional cultural elements into their works and delve into their perceptions of aesthetic trends and cultural identity. Simultaneously, it facilitates comprehension of the motivations and intentions driving their creations, thus enhancing our understanding of the role and significance of traditional culture in contemporary art and interpretation.

The aforementioned research suggestions aim to explore the application of traditional cultural elements in contemporary art and their influence on aesthetic trends and cultural identity in future relevant studies.

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
